How Bees Make Honey

You probably know that we get honey from bees. But how exactly does a bee make honey? It all starts when a honeybee visits a flower. If the bee finds nectar in the flower, it will suck it up with its straw like tongue, called a proboscis. Inside the bee's tummy, the nectar is turned into different kinds of sugar and acid. The acid kills any bacteria, so it doesn't get into the honey and spoil it. The bee moves the mix into its mouth and spits it into honeycombs in the hive. The mix is still pretty watery, so to dry it out the bee will fan it with its wings. When the mix dries, it is thick, sweet honey! Finally to protect the honey, the bee will cover the honeycomb with wax. When a beekeeper goes to get the honey, they will cut off the wax cap and then take the honey out of the honeycombs. The honey is strained to get any leftover pieces of wax out, and then it is put into bottles and sent to stores so you can buy it!

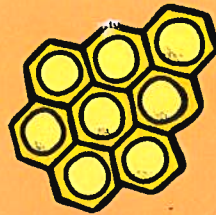

How to Care for a Bird

Having a pet bird can be a lot of fun, but there are some important things to remember in order to properly care for your bird. First, make sure you have a nice cage to put your bird in. There should be room for the bird to move around and a nest if you have any female birds. Keep the cage neat and clean. If you want to get your bird out to play with (gently of course) you can clip the edges of their wings to prevent them from flying away. It does not hurt the bird if you do it correctly, but please talk to your vet before clipping wings so you can be sure you know how. Finally, make sure you feed your birds a healthy diet. You can find bags of birdseed at your local pet store. Birds can enjoy a treat sometimes, such as little bits of fruit, but never feed your bird junk food like candy, chips, or cake.
