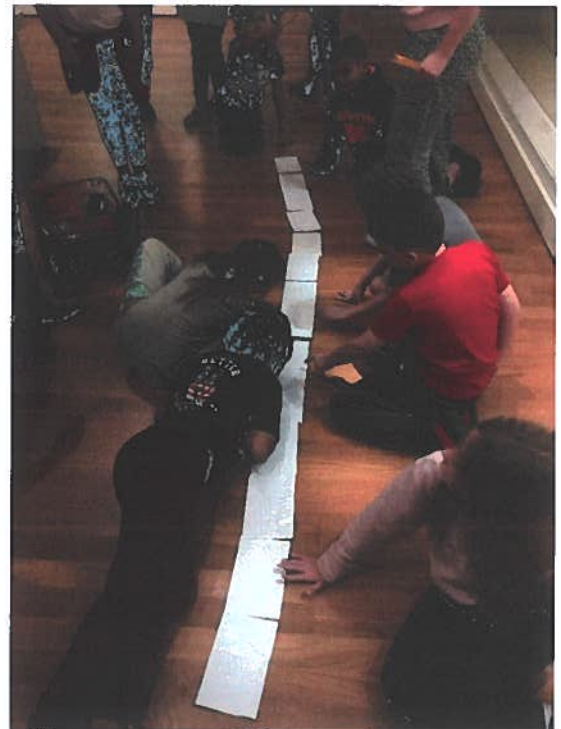
SECOND GRADE
