The Wayne County Health Department in cooperation with Orrville City Schools determined a risk for exposure to the novel Coronavirus. Your student is required to quarantine for 10 days and self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days. If symptoms develop at any point during the quarantine period, call your primary care physician and isolate for 10 days after symptom onset. The date of last contact was _____, therefore, the quarantine will be complete at midnight on _____, and as long as your student does not develop any symptoms, they may return to any extra-curricular activities/employment on _____. If symptoms develop, they need to remain in isolation for 10 days after symptom onset.

Other things to remember:

- Please monitor for temperature and other symptoms twice a day. If any symptoms develop, please reach out to your primary care physician.
- If your child is vaccinated, they do not need to isolate, but they need to have a PCR or antigen test done at 3-5 days. If the test is negative, they can resume normal activities. If the test is positive, they need to isolate for 10 days. Anyone who is vaccinated and has been exposed should wear a mask for 14 days or until they have a negative PCR or antigen test.
- If your child is unvaccinated, they need to isolate for 10 days and monitor for symptoms for 14 days. Unvaccinated students have the option of getting tested on day 5. If they have a negative test, they can resume normal activities on day 8. If they have a positive test, they will need to isolate for 10 days after the positive test.
- Others in the household **are able** to go to work/school/stores as needed as long as your student **does not** develop symptoms. Household members are currently considered a contact to a contact and are considered low risk of developing symptoms at this time. If your student develops symptoms, anyone who is a household contact will then need to isolate for 10 days.
- It is recommended for your student to separate from other household members, if possible. This will help limit the amount of exposure should your student develop symptoms. Wear a facemask when around others in the household and maintain a 6ft distance. The student should stay in their own bedroom and use a separate bathroom, if possible so that if they develop symptoms others in the household do not need to isolate.
- Frequent wiping of high touch areas with a disinfectant.
- During this time of quarantine, it is important that your student does not leave the home, and no one else comes to visit or stay with your student. This will limit the contact to others so if symptoms do develop you are doing your part to slow the spread of coronavirus.
